


Figure 1 Test cases in the mixed α/β test set solved by *Fragon*. The fragment placed by *Phaser* is shown as yellow sticks.




Figure 2 Test cases in the all- β test set solved by *Fragon*. The fragment placed by *Phaser* is shown as yellow sticks.
