Explicit need for decision	"So the reason you are here today is really for us all to put our heads together to see what the best possible treatment for you is <i>to try and deal with those spaces</i> " [Dentist 6]
	<i>"I think you just need to be armed with all the</i> information, so you can make an informed decision with time" [Dentist 5]
More than one option	"There's different things that we can do to help you out so what we're going to try to do is explain the different ways of doing it" [CC03, Orthodontist]
Preference-based decision	"I think with you it could probably go either way but it just needs a bit more planning" [CC02, Orthodontist]
