Those accepted have come from 19 different countries, showing we truly are an international journal. The reviewers have to be congratulated on an average turn round of 10 days leading to an initial decision inside 18 days.

I have been Editor-in-Chief for six years and it is my intention to stand down at the end of 2017. I have really enjoyed being Editor and although it keeps me busy with, on average, two submissions per day it has benefited me in many ways. We must ensure that we create and foster the highest standards of conduct in all our institutions, so that those we teach understand what is and what is not acceptable.

I would like to thank all the reviewers who have supported the Journal in the past year and it is my pleasure to announce that Dr. Janice A. Townsend of Louisiana State University, U.S.A. is the Reviewer of the Year.

I would like to welcome Marcelo Bönecker, Professor and Chair Department of Paediatric Dentistry, School of Dentistry, University of Sao Paulo, to the Editorial Board.

I will take this opportunity to thank the two Associate Editors, Dr Anne O'Connell and Dr Sondos Albadri, for all their help and advice.

My thanks also go to the team at Wiley-Blackwell, Maria Borja (Editorial Assistant) and Bhavani Ponnivalavan (Production Editor) for their support and hard work, together with Mie Bak (Journal Publishing Manager), who has brought a lot of innovation to the Journal, such as the *Editor's Choice*.
