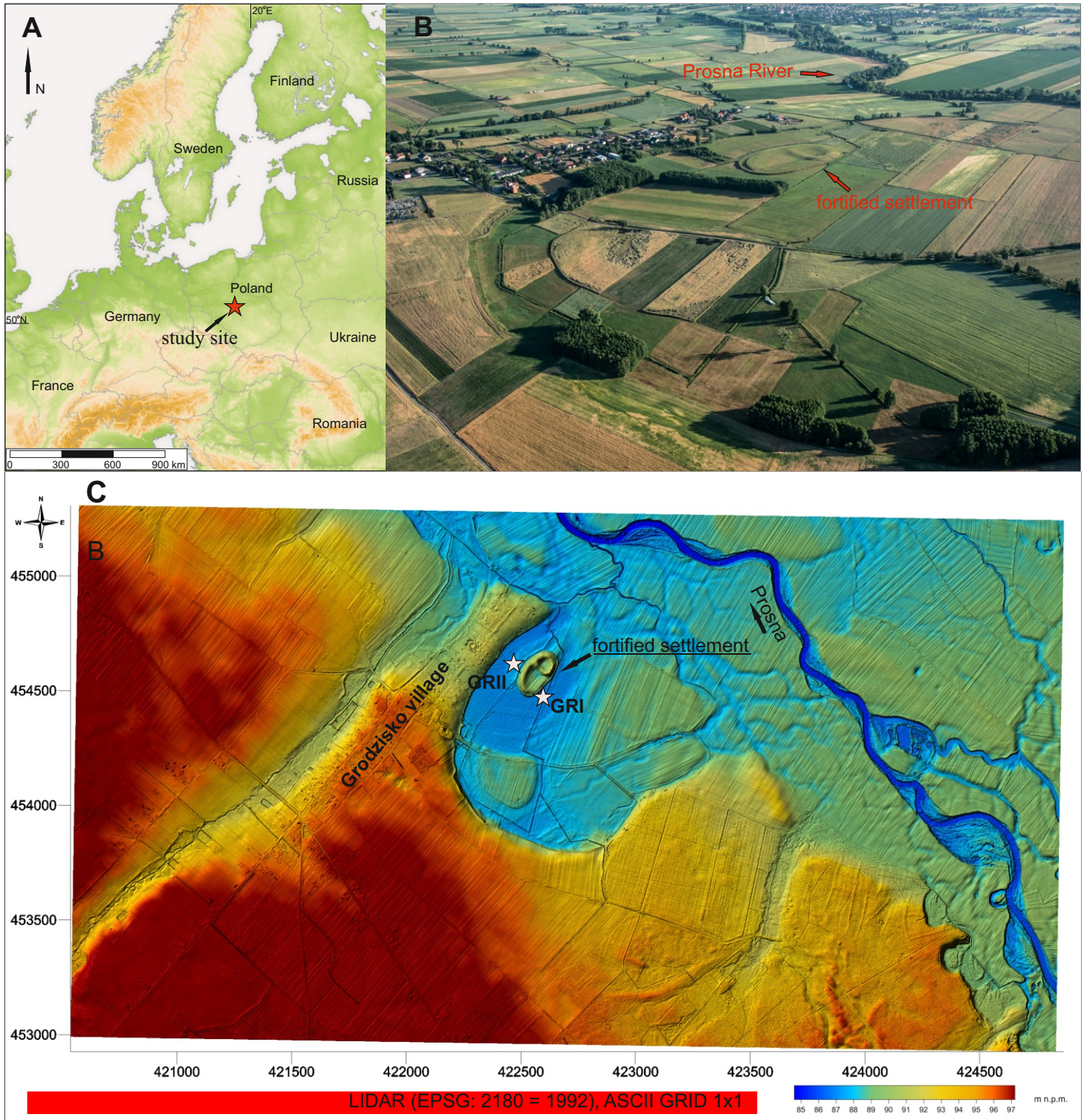


Fig. 1. Study site
