Attending the Leeds-Hull MA TESOL Conference 2024 was a highlight of my postgraduate life at the University of Leeds. As a MA TESOL Studies student, I presented a poster on "Measuring Digital Competence: Pre-service Teachers (PST) Readiness for Online Teaching", based on a small-scale study I conducted during my BA in Education (TESOL) at the University of Nottingham.

Selecting the most relevant information for the poster was a challenge as I wanted to include everything in one poster. Therefore, I am glad I sent a draft to the conference committee who provided feedback and made amendments before the presentation day. It was nerve-wrecking to present in a face-toface conference. However, familiar faces in the audience made me feel super relieved and enjoyed the process.

I am glad I decided to present at the conference as it provided a chance for me to meet with a renowned researcher in vocabulary acquisition, Dr Diane Schmitt. Our conversation encouraged me to think and explore on the relationship between Malaysian pre-service teachers' digital competence and their strategies in using digital technologies to teach vocabulary to their future students. In addition, as I engaged with other researchers who were also researching digital competence, I realised that it is an emerging topic for research globally and this encourages me to pursue my PhD in the related field for teacher education.

Overall, I really enjoyed presenting my poster and meeting other researchers at the conference. I look forward to presenting at more conferences in the future.

Hillary Place Papers on tour
